

Student Policy 5302 Approved: 11/2/2016 Revised: 07/19/18

I. PURPOSE

This policy establishes the type of medical information school personnel of Athlos Academy of Jefferson Parish may and may not communicate to the parent/guardian(s) of their students.

II. DEFINITIONS

A. Psychotropic drug: A substance that is used in the diagnosis, treatment, or prevention of a disease or as a component of a medication and is intended to have an altering effect on perception, emotion, or behavior.

III. POLICY

- A. A teacher may not:
 - 1. Recommend that a student be administered a psychotropic drug;
 - 2. Specify or identify any specific mental health diagnosis for a student; or
 - 3. Use a parent's or guardian's refusal to consent to the administration of a psychotropic drug to a student or to a psychiatric evaluation, screening, or examination of a student as grounds for prohibiting the student from attending any class or participating in any school-related activity or as the sole basis of accusations of child abuse or neglect against the parent or guardian.
- B. A teacher may:
 - 1. Suggest a student be assessed or evaluated by a qualified employee of the school who performs such functions;
 - 2. Assess or evaluate a student's academic readiness, performance, or achievement; and
 - 3. Discuss any aspect of a student's behavior or academic progress with the student's parent or guardian or other employees of the school as necessary
- C. An employee of Athlos Academy of Jefferson Parish who is a registered nurse, nurse practitioner, physician, or an appropriately credentialed mental health professional or teacher may recommend that a student be evaluated by an appropriate medical practitioner.

D. Violation of this policy by school personnel is cause for disciplinary action.
